**The 1811 revolt was the largest slave revolt in US history.**

On Jan. 8, 1811 our ancestors' stood up and attempted to destroy the hated slavery regime in Louisiana, free the slaves and establish a free republic just as the slaves had done in Haiti.

We must pay tribute to their struggle by educating everyone about this struggle led by **Charles Deslondes**. 500 men, women and children rose up and marched down the east bank River Road from St. John and St. Charles Parishes headed for New Orleans.

As they marched they chanted "On to New Orleans" and "Freedom or Death".

**We must band together and honor this brave attempt to end slavery.**
